## GOOD REASONS TO DO RESEARCH IN FRANCE





France ranks **2**<sup>nd</sup> in the world for Fields **Medals** (mathematics) and 4<sup>th</sup> for Nobel Prizes. It's ranked **3**<sup>rd</sup> in the Shanghai **Ranking** (2022) and 9<sup>th</sup> for the impact of scientific publications.

A country of innovation

France is the **2**<sup>nd</sup> **most innovative European nation** (European Patent
Office). It remains the 3<sup>rd</sup> largest recipient
of European funding for research and
innovation (Horizon 2020).

One of the world's most research-intensive nations

France ranks 5th among OECD countries for R&D expenditure, with 53,4 billion euros of annual investment. Its academic community includes nearly 310,000 researchers.

A meeting place for researchers from all over the world

With 38% of foreign PhD students, France is the 4<sup>th</sup> largest host country for young researchers. Thanks to the "Passeport Talent" residence permit, everything is taken care of to facilitate the arrival of international academics.

A global network...

French research centers are present in more than **250 research institutions around the world**. 65% of French publications are co-published with foreign institutions.

6 ...At the heart of international projects

French research is involved in major European and international research projects: particle physics with CERN, Arianespace, ITER project on nuclear fusion, Surface project, etc.

A research system centred on the universities

Within French universities, 270 PhD programs enroll 70,000 PhD students and award 14,000 doctorates each year, both in French and in English.

**Q** Leading institutions

With 33,000 employees in 1,100 laboratories, the CNRS is the 2<sup>nd</sup> largest research organization in the world in terms of scientific publications. The CEA is the 1<sup>st</sup> largest patent filing research organization in Europe.

A dynamic R&D environment

Two-thirds of research in France is conducted in the private sector. A total of 600,000 individuals work in corporate research and development, and foreign companies represent one-fifth of private R&D investments in France.

A major economic powerhouse

France, the **7**<sup>th</sup> economic power in the world and **2**<sup>nd</sup> in Europe in terms of GDP, is Europe's first destination for international investments in 2022.
